#### Countryside Services Liz Appleton, Ranger

My first day as the new ranger for Basildon District Council Countryside Services started rather unusually. On arrival at Wat Tyler Country Park I found the gate locked. A kind volunteer let me in and after dipping my boots and spraying the wheels of my car I was allowed to enter - the first time I have been disinfected before starting a job!

The outbreak of foot and mouth disease has meant that my induction could not go as planned. The programme of activities prepared for me, including a Nifty Fifty walk at Noak Bridge Nature Reserve had to be cancelled. I was able, however, to attend the March meeting of the Noak Bridge Nature Reserve Society committee, and meet the committee members.

As the new Ranger, I will be continuing the hard work that Luke Bennett, Will Farmer and the rest of the team have undertaken. The main aim of my role is to carry on the management of several key sites managed by the Countryside Service, including Noak Bridge Nature Reserve. This will allow Luke to focus on the development of a new Country Park at Wickford. Responsibility for the site now rests with me, but the handover will continue over the next 2 - 3 months. Some of my first tasks are to oversee the work on the new easy access trail, lead the regular monthly work parties and assist the Society in the planning of the Open Day.

Prior to working for Basildon District I was employed as a Ranger on the South Downs in Sussex, and I have also worked as a Ranger in Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Hampshire. Coming to work here is very exciting, with the superb range of wildlife habitats and species, some of which are unique to this area.

#### **Countryside Services**

#### **Project Update**

Work on the easy access trail started as planned at the end of January. The route through the scrub was cleared and excavation commenced. Unfortunately, the extraordinary wet weather meant that the works were flooded and the heavy machinery could not get on site without causing damage or becoming stuck. Work had to cease.

The recent outbreak of foot and mouth disease means that the site has been closed since the beginning of March. This is in line with guidance from MAFF. Whilst new cases of the disease are still being detected across Britain, as well as more locally in Essex, we are still trying to prevent the spread of the disease to wildlife. The virus can affect deer, hedgehogs, rats and elephants ( not that I have heard any reports of wild elephants on the Reserve!). Whilst dogs cannot contract the disease, they can carry the infection, making it all the more important to keep them under close control and not let them run free. On present advice from the Government, it is anticipated that the Reserve will remain closed for <u>at least</u> 2 weeks after the last outbreak is confirmed anywhere in Britain, and possibly longer.

With the continuing rain, the contractors have not been able to carry on with the work. Once the ground has dried out work should continue, with strict disinfecting procedures in place. One part of the access work that can take place is the installation of the motorbike-proof but wheelchair accessible, barriers. I am contacting contractors and aim to have the new barriers as soon as possible.

The monthly work party had to relocate to the Norsey Wood workshop and members made bird boxes to attract species such as robin, flycatcher and sparrow to nest. Just how long we will be excluded from the site cannot be predicted, however, I intend to try and keep the work party usefully employed and carry on with the planned works as far as is possible in these extreme circumstances.
